IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO PLANT YOUR FALL BULBS!! Fall Bulbs should be



planted as soon as the ground is cool, when evening temperatures average between 40° - 50° F.

Ground temperatures reaching 40° - 50° F during fall is most common in cold climates (zones 1-7), generally 6-8 weeks before the

ground freezes. However, as long as you can dig and your ground is workable, you can still plant!

Prepare the Planting Bed



Dig soil so it's loose and workable. If it's not an established garden bed, chances are the soil could use the addition of some organic matter such as compost or peat moss, available at most local garden retailers. Loosen soil in the planting bed to a depth of at least 8".

Plant

Depending on the bulb, follow the recommendation on the label for planting depth. As a general rule, plant big bulbs



about 8" deep and small bulbs about 5" deep. Set the bulb in the hole pointy side up or the roots down.

Water



Now that the bulbs are planted, back fill with soil over the hole, lightly compress the soil but do not pack it. Water

once to stimulate root growth and to fill any air pockets.


